



School Matters – Newsletter # 5



1. EXAMS / CONTROLLED TESTS:

With the long-weekends and special school holidays behind us, it's time to put shoulder to the wheel and prepare for the Term 2 exams/controlled tests that start on the 2^{nd} June 2025 for Grade 4 – 7 learners.

Grade 1, 2 and 3 learners continue with their assessments.

TAKE NOTE OF THE FOLLOWING:

- a. Please ensure that your child is well-prepared and rested.
- b. Learners must bring their own stationery.
- c. All learners must be at their classes by 7:30. DO NOT BE LATE.
- d. Learners may not leave before 13:00.
- e. A medical certificate is required if your child misses an assessment.
- f. <u>SCHOOL ATTENDANCE REMAINS COMPULSORY FOR ALL</u> <u>LEARNERS UNTIL THE END OF THE TERM.</u>

2. <u>WINTER UNIFORM</u>:

Learners must be in <u>FULL WINTER UNIFORM</u> until the 31 August 2025. Please ensure that your child is dressed neatly and that their hair is cut and worn in accordance with the school rules.

3. FUND-RAISING

J & T Day will be held on Friday, 9 May 2025. R10.00 is payable. Learners are expected to dress neatly and appropriately, i.e. <u>neat long jeans, t-shirt and a warm jacket</u>. NO SHORTS, MAKE-UP OR JEWELLERY IS ALLOWED AND GIRLS MUST TIE THEIR HAIR UP. There will also be popcorn for sale (R5.00) as well as Grab-a-Cake tickets for R1.00 per ticket.



4. SICK LEARNERS

As winter approaches, colds, flu and stomach bugs increase. We request that parents refrain from sending their child to school if they are sick. The classes are full and germs spread easily amongst the learners and staff. Please also do not send your child to school if they have LICE, RINGWORM or PINK EYE. Please remember however, that should a learner be absent from school for more than two days, that a medical certificate is required.



5. SCHOOL HOURS

All learners must be at their classes by **7:30** every school day. **PLEASE BE CONSIDERATE AND ENSURE THAT YOUR CHILD IS AT SCHOOL ON TIME**. Arriving late shows disrespect to the teachers as well as the learners. Thank you to all parents who unfalteringly ensure that their child is at school on time.

6. PRIVATE SPORT AND CULTURAL ACHIEVEMENTS

If your child participates in any private sport or cultural activities and achieves provincial colours, please inform **Mr. Botha**, our Sport Co-Ordinator. The following information will be required:

- a. The confirmation letter must be on an original letterhead and signed by the principal or coach of the club;
- b. The discipline and level your child participated in;
- c. All accomplishments will be verified by the school;
- d. The level of recognition or acknowledgment is at the school's discretion;
- e. Recognition will be awarded at the Prize-Giving Assembly at the end of the year.

GATES A & CARE LOCKED AT 07:30, GATE B IS LOCKED AT 7:40. Parents and transporters are to ensure that children are at school by 07:30 the very latest. Please respect this directive and refrain from dropping your children off at school late. Allow your child to start their school day on a positive note by being at school on time. It is very disruptive and unfair to learners who are already in class and busy with work when a child enters the classroom late. Parents may not sign in and/or stand in line on behalf of their child. <u>Please be considerate</u>. GATE D is for PRE-SCHOOL LEARNERS ONLY. Learners arriving late and leaving early will be recorded in accordance with instructions from the GDE.

PARCELS / DELIVERIES FOR LEARNERS

NO PARCELS will be accepted at Reception for learners in any grade. This includes, but is not limited to lunches, projects, homework, PT clothes, sports kits, school bags, stationery, tuck money etc. Kindly ensure that your child has everything he/she needs before being dropped off at school. THERE WILL BE NO LENIENCY IN THIS REGARD, AS PER SCHOOL RULES. Please do not request our staff to disregard instructions given by the Management Team. Only chronic medication will be accepted, e.g. insulin.

RELIGIOUS REGALIA The school is tolerant of all religions whilst being a secular Public Ordinary School. Parents must write a letter, or have a meeting with the Principal to explain why a learner should wear a specific form of religious regalia e.g. red cotton ribbon on the left hand of a Hindu child, a turban for a Sikh boy or a hajib for a Grade 5 Muslim girl. Grade 6 and 7 Muslim boys may leave school at 12:30 on a Friday to attend prayers on condition that no assessments are being written. Please refer to the Religion Policy on the D6 Communicator under RESOURCES. There will be no exceptions. Please abide by the School's Policy.

HOLIDAYS

Parents must please arrange their holidays in accordance with the school calendar and ensure that their child/children attend school during the allocated term dates as set out by the Education Department. As school attendance is compulsory by law for all children between the ages of 7 and 15, no Educator or Principal may give permission for pupils to take leave during the terms. (Please refer to the Prospectus). Learners who miss assessments due to vacations taken during the term will receive zero for any missed assessments. There will be no leniency.
